The Emergency Preparedness Committee in conjunction with the Timber Valley Board of Directors will be presenting **Douglas County Environmental Health** who will be doing:

Food Handler Training

If you plan on using the kitchen or oven in the Clubhouse in the future or being part of any cooking groups preparing the delicious meals we enjoy you need to plan on attending this training. Because the kitchen contains a commercial oven, proper training is required prior to use.

The following will be covered:

- Introductions and Instruction
- * (You may take notes and use them on the test)
 - Video
 - Importance of food safety—Answer any questions.
 - Health and hygiene—Answer any questions.
 - Temperature control—Answer any questions.
 - Avoiding cross contamination—Answer any questions.
 - Cleaning and sanitizing—Answer any questions.
 - The food worker—Answer any questions.
 - Review and answer any additional questions.
 - Test. You may use your notes and the handout during the test. Passing grade is 15/20 or 75%.
 - Fill out Food Handler Card and pay the \$10 fee. The fee can be paid with either a check or cash. No debit or credit cards. Bring your ID to have if required.
