In Case You Missed It: Last Tuesday's Emergency Prep Speaker - Rob Rippy, the District Manager for Sutherlin Water Control District

Rob informed of us plans for the rehabilitation of both Cooper Creek and Plat I Reservoir, stating that both reservoirs are well-built, well-maintained, and in excellent condition. Cooper Creek Reservoir (which drains into Cooper Creek) serves recreation, drinking water, and flood control needs. Plat I (which drains into Sutherlin Creek) serves flood control, recreation, and irrigation needs. Sharon asked about mercury pollution, and Rob informed us that it is not an issue in Cooper Creek but that mercury and arsenic are found in Plat I from left-over mining materials.

Initial efforts for the rehabilitation process at Cooper Creek will focus on the first 200 yards from the base of the dam and improve shortcomings in the spillway (through either sectional repair or entire replacement). Maintaining the drinking water supply remains the top priority throughout the rehabilitation period. Recreational activities including boating may be temporarily impacted.

To our great relief, we learned that seismic analysis indicates that Cooper Creek dam can withstand a 9.3 earthquake with some expected settling but without catastrophic failure.
