Is it corrugated? Can it be recycled?

We're still confused about what cardboard should be recycled, what discarded.

Corrugated is made up of three visible layers – two flat outside layers enclosing a "wavy" layer in the middle. The tell-tale inner layer has a symmetrical fluted appearance that makes corrugated cushiony and a good protector for shipped items. The layers are usually thick, heavy and pulpy, but not always. Check an edge to confirm three layers, and place flattened corrugated boxes in the recycling bin.

Cardboard is a single flat sheet of heavier card stock. It's typically used as food boxes to hold cereal, tea, crackers, mixes, pastas, some frozen foods. It only contains. It does not protect like corrugated does. It cannot be recycled. Discard in the big red dumpster. Please do not put it in the recycle bin.

Possible exception to recycling corrugated: If it's held pizza or other food and contains food waste, discard in the dumpster.
