“Winter Snow Storm – December 2021 The winter storm that began on December 25th, 2021, was a breath of fresh air for city staff. Although Snowmageddon in 2019 had a major impact on the City of Sutherlin, this latest winter storm had little to no impact to city services. We contribute part of this success to our ‘lessons learned’ at the after-action review and efforts made by city staff, to reduce impacts to area residents during natural disasters. We now have a designated Emergency Operations Center, installed backup generators at city facilities, opened the warming center earlier, and purchased a pickup mounted snowplow for Public Works. Without working towards correcting the lessons learned from Snowmageddon, this storm could have been worse for Sutherlin residents.”
