Rules and Regulations Reminder - Move Winter Extra Rigs to Storage by April 1

Spring is here! Second rigs we have kept on our lots for winter care must be moved to storage by April 1. Why do we see second, small rigs on some lots year round?...



From the Rules and Regulations (on the Members Only page): VEHICLES:

3. Two (2) private passenger non-commercial motor vehicles plus an RV are permitted per lot. Only ONE INHABITED RV per lot is allowed. A small, uninhabited RV may be kept on a lot if it is used as means of transportation. A small RV not to exceed twenty-three (23) feet long may be kept on a lot if it is used as daily (or weekly) transportation. A second recreational vehicle will be allowed on the lot from November 1st to April 1st for winter care. It is not to be occupied and should be parked so that it does not obstruct the neighbor's view. Also, an uninhabited RV is allowed on the lot for a maximum of 48 hours, in any seven (7) consecutive days, for the purpose of loading and unloading contents. Members may have additional time to have an extra RV on the lot, but Manager's permission must be obtained first. (07/28/92; 05/07/93; 05/12/93; 12/17/96; 03/12/09; 05/12/11)

The check-in lasts only 10 minutes! Feel free just to <u>listen in</u> if you are more comfortable doing so.

What occurs during the radio roll call? The Block Captains/Co-Captains on each street report their member/renter count, all others are then asked/welcome to check-in, and then participants present any announcements they may have.

Our Block Captain/Co-Captain system helps keep everyone safe in an emergency—and it works best when we all participate! Our recent rainstorm and previous power outage in freezing temperatures, reminds us that staying connected with our block neighbors and using our FRS/GMRS radio can make a big safety difference.
