Timber Valley Rules and Regulations Reminder: BBQs and Burning

1. When burning or barbecuing, a fire extinguisher should be on hand and a water hose connected and immediately available for firefighting at all times. If an owner is gone for a season, a water hose shall be connected and immediately available for firefighting at all times. (10/21/92)
2. Barbecues of ordinary domestic proportions are permitted. (10/21/92; 06/18/15)
3. No outside burning of debris or waste on an individual's lot is permitted except by propane weed burners when approved by the Manager. Recreational fires are permitted only in commercially manufactured fire pits or fireplaces that completely enclose the fire. Wood burning fire pit or fireplaces may not be used in fire weather during red flag warnings. Recreational burning shall be discontinued if any smoke or odors cause annoyance to others. Ashes shall be stored and disposed of in a safe manner. (12/17/96; 06/18/15)
4. Areas where recreational burning or barbecuing are conducted shall have sufficient clearance from vegetation and combustible material to prevent escape of the fire. (06/18/15)
5. No fire shall be left unattended at any time. (04/28/88)
6. Smoking is not permitted in the storage area. (10/19/12)
