Calling new Block Coordinators!

Timber Valley is fortunate to have an Emergency Response Plan designed to help us effectively address various types of emergencies and reduce their impact on the Park and its members. At the core of this plan is the organization of our streets into "Blocks," each with a Block Coordinator (previously known as a Block Captain) and a well-structured communication system using handheld Family Radio Service (FRS) radios — walkie-talkies that many of us already own. These radios do not require a license. (General Mobile Radio Service (GMRS) radios, which do require a license, can also be used.)

Radio communication practice takes place every Monday at 4 pm using a brief script and usually lasts about 10 minutes. "Practice makes perfect"—especially when the time comes that we really need to communicate.

The primary responsibility of a Block Coordinator is simple but important: know how many members and renters are currently residing on your street (Block). In an emergency, this awareness—combined with the ability to communicate by radio — ensures that accurate and timely information can be shared, special needs can be communicated, and resources can be directed where they are most needed.

This is not a difficult role, and training is provided. It's a great way to help Timber Valley stay safe—and a wonderful way to get to know your neighbors!

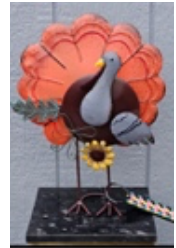
Card Bingo
