Timber Valley Water Use Monitoring

Did you know that Timber Valley monitors our daily park water use? We do! We have a talented team of 5 people that keep this important record up to date. This is not a committee, has no budget and works using the simple teamwork approach. Pretty neat.

We know the DAILY park water usage on every day going back many years. This information is recorded in a sheet such that we can compare a certain day with the exact same day in previous years. This monitoring project was started back when we were having very high water bills, and no one knew why. Eventually it was discovered that we had major underground leaks in our water system that was resolved by replacing all the water "risers" on every lot.

The water use monitoring continues to this day, and is still saving us considerable money by quickly identifying water use that's out of normal range. Here are a few interesting things.

- 1: We have identified extra water use caused when old, weather-beaten water hoses on our lots burst. We can narrow down to the day when an event like this happens, and have sent out requests for everyone to check their hoses for leaks.
- 2: During the annual meeting, July 22/23, the water use fell by quite a bit. We wonder why? Interesting.
- 3: As this is being written, a higher-than-expected use was measured on Aug. 3, so we will look at the numbers for the following day to see if this is a single event, or a trend that could be a leak somewhere.
- 4: We provide to the city of Sutherlin a picture of the water meter on a certain day every month, to be used as a cross-check against their meter readings.
