#### **Shed Replacement**

Just recently the Park has had to totally replace two sheds. Sheds that have sheet rock for ceilings and walls with insulation behind them require extra care to dispose of the materials. Under the metal roof are shingles that also require that same care. They cannot be burned on our burn pile therefore the materials need to go in the dumpster.

How to protect your shed? 1. Make sure there is ventilation under the shed. 2. Remove wall to wall carpet. 3. Make sure there is ventilation in the attic.
