Red Shirt Friday

Every Friday, people across the country wear red shirts to show support for service members and veterans. The tradition is a reminder to honor their sacrifices and let them know they are remembered and appreciated. Join us by wearing red each Friday to stand in solidarity and gratitude.

The tradition has several grassroots origins. MarineParents.com (2004) notes that supporters began wearing red on Fridays after a Canadian tradition was shared by a military parent. Around the same time, a 2005 campaign encouraged Americans to "wear something red" each Friday to show visible support for deployed troops (Soldiers' Angels, 2014). In 2006, Canadian military spouses Lisa Miller and Karen Boier helped expand the movement, and in the U.S., Lloyd (Doc) Hofmeister popularized the practice under the banner of "Remember Everyone Deployed" (R.E.D.) (Military.com, 2018; Soldiers' Angels, 2014). Today, Red Shirt Friday remains a simple, enduring way for civilians to honor military service and stand in solidarity with deployed troops.
