New business

Dar Hoch asked if it was time to raise the suggested contribution for meals from \$5.00 to \$7.00 due to costs going up. Richard made the motion to raise the suggested contribution to \$7.00

and Rhonda Scott seconded. The vote was unanimous and the motion was passed. This change will begin at the Thanksgiving dinner.

Monthly/weekly Breakfast/Lunch: Chris asked how everyone feels about being back monthly or weekly meals. The discussion was mainly favorable while acknowledging the challenges of having someone take charge. Ann David suggested alternating breakfast and lunch every other month to start and waiting until after the new year to organize it. This is tabled until January 2026.

Clubhouse cleaning: Chris stated it is going well and she hopes to prove to the board that volunteers can keep the clubhouse clean so the paid service can be stopped. It would save us over \$6,000 a year which hits our M&Os. There was discussion on what was done in the past and concern if the current volunteers couldn't continue.

Lindy stated she used her steam mop in the bathroom and it got the tiles really clean. The plan is to ask Randy to purchase a steam mop.

Currently the cleaning service comes on Wednesday and have been observed doing some very unsanitary things which Chris will report to the board.

Trish volunteered to help Thursday evenings and she said David could help on Monday mornings.

Craft Fair: 11/15 at the senior center. We have an 8' table reserved to sell hand made items and home made baked goods and candy. The cost is \$15. We need a couple of volunteers to man the table.

The membership decided not to participate in the craft fair at the community center as \$50 is too much. Chris will remove our name from the list.

Cookies/Toys: Early December the Fire department will come by to pick up toys. We generally give them a small plate of cookies.

Later in the month, we give a large tray of cookies to the Police department, the Post Office and the Fire Department.

Gift Cards: A motion was made to procure \$500 worth of gift cards for Tim's Tree House. Another \$500 in gift cards was requested for the food bank. As this will take almost half of the funds in our account, there was some discussion as to cutting back this year or perhaps fundraising before a decision is made. The motion was rescinded and the subject was tabled until next month.

Halloween Basket Drawing: Georgia Smalley and Kathy Perry were the lucky winners of the baskets. Thank you to Sharon Elliot for donating them.
