Emergency Communications

In a true emergency, nothing comes closer to helping people than communications. When the power is off, and cell towers are down, there are still many methods of communication....all are available here at Timber Valley.

- 1) Walk next door and knock on your neighbors door! This seems very basic, but goes a long way towards helping each other. (remember neighbors helping neighbors?)
- 2) Even if cell towers are not working well enough for a phone call, many times text messages WILL work. This would be the basic SMS message. During

“Snowmageddon”, we used SMS text messages to communicate with people in other states so they could look up and report our weather forecast.

3) Timber Valley has an established walkie talkie (FRS) communications system for this exact use! Please join us each a Monday at 4pm on channel,6 for a test of the system. No license required. All are welcome. It is very comforting to hear and talk with your neighbors in an emergency.

4) Timber Valley also has an active Ham Radio club with a base station in our clubhouse designed just for emergency communication. You can see the antennas on the roof of the clubhouse.

5) We also have Starlink systems in the park, many will run directly off battery power, to provide unlimited high-speed internet, phone and text messaging. This is satellite communication, and works wonderfully. I have personally done a video call with someone in another country on the other side of our planet while I had no 120v electric power or cell coverage. Just amazing for emergency communication.
