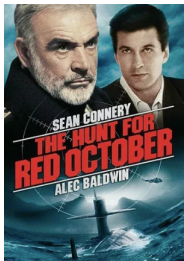

Outdoor Hose

So why have a garden hose outside? Since 1992 Timber Valley rules and regulations have required that a hose be connected and left outside, even if the lot owner is gone for the season.

This is a very important Emergency tool that recently was put to good use! A month or two ago, a small fire occurred on one of our patios, right next to the RV. A sharp eyed Member spotted the fire, ran over, grabbed the hose, and was able to quickly put out the fire before any real damage occurred. This could have been very bad if that RV had caught fire.



Please check that your outdoor hose is in place and available, and don't hesitate to call 911 (Fire Department) if a fire occurs.

Please Clean the Grill

Please - Clean the grill after you use it so the next person doesn't have to.



It's easy to clean when the grill is hot.

Clean your grill after each use by heating it to high for 10-15 minutes to burn off debris, then scrubbing the grates with a nylon or stainless steel brush. For better results, use steam cleaning by rubbing a wet brush or pumice stone on hot grates. Finally, wipe the grates with oil to prevent rust, and scrape the grease tray.
