MyShake App - Earthquake Early Warning for Oregon *Brought to you by your Emergency Preparedness Committee*

The MyShake app provides Earthquake Early Warning (EEW) alerts for Oregon, Washington, and California. Using a network of seismic sensors operated by the United States Geological Survey and partners, the app can send an alert seconds after an earthquake is detected.



Depending on your distance from the epicenter, you may receive the alert before shaking begins and giving you time to Drop, Cover, and Hold On.

While earthquakes are less frequent here than in parts of California, Oregon faces risk from the Cascadia Subduction Zone. Even a few seconds of warning can reduce injuries.

In Case You Missed it: Social Hour Speaker Jessica Cannon *Submitted by Rachael Smithey*

Last Friday's Social Hour welcomed Jessica Cannon, owner of Social Strategies and former Sutherlin Chamber of Commerce Director, to share insights on marketing for communities and small businesses.

Jessica highlighted a common challenge many of us have experienced: outdated online information. Incorrect hours, old websites, or missing details about where to stay, eat, or visit can create frustration and impact the entire community. We have all seen inaccurate Google Business Profile entries or outdated Facebook pages. Because these are often the first places people look, keeping them current is especially important.

She also discussed the gap between high-cost marketing agencies and do-it-yourself tools. Many agencies charge significant markups, while DIY options can be time-consuming and difficult to coordinate. To address this, Jessica operates as a marketing broker, working with trusted vendors, coordinating projects, and providing a single, clear invoice. This approach helps simplify the process while supporting local businesses and vendors.

Marketing does not need to be done all at once. Simple updates, such as refreshing brochures or ensuring accurate online listings, can make a meaningful difference.

For Timber Valley, the discussion included updating the park brochure and map, enhancing the new member orientation folder, and exploring the idea of a small marketing group within the park. Jessica also offered to provide free estimates for materials related to the park and the Escapade.
