We love our pets! Here is an excerpt from the current Timber Valley rules and regulations about your pets.

 PETS: 

1. Only household pets (i.e., dog, cat, bird) may be kept on a lot, provided these pets are not kept, bred, or maintained for commercial purposes. (04/28/88)
2. No more than three (3) pets per site shall be allowed. (04/28/88)

3. Any animal the Board finds to be objectionable, by reason of its nature, temperament, or frequent annoyance, following a letter of intent and opportunity for appeal, shall be removed from the park by its owner. (04/28/88)
4. Pets shall not be permitted to roam freely within the Park. They shall be held on a leash by a person who is in control of that pet, when outside of a fenced area in the Park. The pet shall otherwise be confined to its owner's lot or in the fenced dog run. Pets are not to be left outside of RV while owners are away.
Pet waste shall be promptly collected anywhere on Park property (including the canyon area, meadow, entrance, dog run and the owner's lot) and shall be properly disposed of by the pet owner. (07/28/99; 10/08/08; 12/13/18; 11/17/22)
5. Owners shall not allow their pets, other than "SERVICE DOGS" within any of the Park's buildings.
(04/29/92)

Safety Check Reminder: Smoke, Propane, and Carbon Monoxide Detectors

At last month's Emergency Preparedness Committee meeting (everyone is welcome to attend), we discussed an important safety reminder. Please take a few minutes to check your smoke alarms, propane detectors, and carbon monoxide detectors.

Our RVs rely on propane appliances, heaters, and electrical systems that make life comfortable. Because fuel-burning appliances can produce carbon monoxide, an odorless and colorless gas, working smoke, propane, and carbon monoxide detectors are especially important.

Consider doing a quick safety check:

- Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors using the test button
- Replace batteries or detectors when needed
- Check the expiration date on detectors. Many need replacement every 5 to 10 years
- Make sure propane and carbon monoxide detectors are not blocked by furniture or dust

These checks take only a few minutes and can make a big difference in protecting our RVs, our neighbors, and our animal companions.

Safety Check Reminder: Smoke, Propane, and Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Smoke Detector



Test monthly, replace every 10 years

Propane Detector



Install near floor, check for leaks regularly

Carbon Monoxide Detector



Place on each level, especially near bedrooms
