What Is Fire Season?

In Douglas County, “fire season” is the time of year when wildfire risk becomes significantly higher due to dry vegetation, warm temperatures, and changing weather conditions. During fire season, restrictions may be placed on outdoor burning, equipment use, and other activities to help reduce the risk of human-caused wildfires.

Recent Douglas County fire season start - end dates:

- 2025: June 6 - October 10
- 2024: June 14 - October 21
- 2023: June 9 - October 9
- 2022: June 24 - October 23
- 2021: May 28 - October 6

Current fire season information, fire danger levels, and restrictions can be found on the Douglas Forest Protective Association website (dfpa.net). Disposal of “stuff”

By now most of us have probably seen the new sign at our “burn pile”.

“Only natural tree limbs, brush, plants, leaves, or other clippings are permitted to be placed here. These are the ONLY materials that can legally be burned.”

This new requirement raises the next question, “what do I do with other stuff I need to dispose of? Timber Valley’s trash bill is based upon weight. The heavier the dumpster, the more we all are charged to dispose of it...our trash bill is high, and I am told we just had a rate increase. Randy requests that no lumber of any kind be put in the dumpster. A sign on the side of the dumpster shows what else is prohibited in the dumpster.

It is up to you to haul away items you brought into the park or inherited with your lot.

Things like old wood deck / stair boards, wheels and tires, batteries, furniture, etc. must be disposed of by you, outside of the park. Please check and determine where you will dispose of this material.

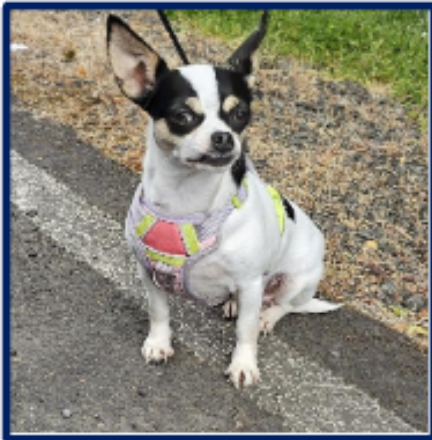

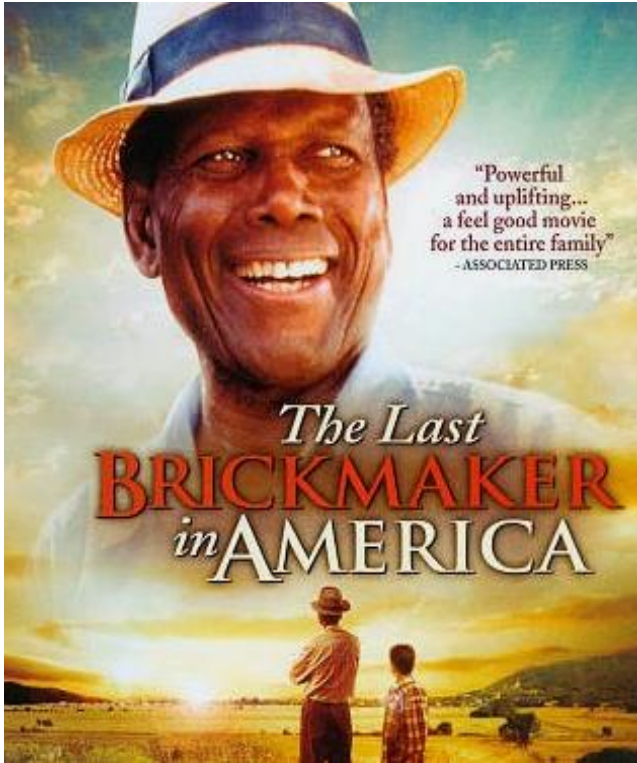
