Emergency Prep This Week: Clear Communication - A Skill That Still Matters

Many of us spent years RVing with a spouse, partner, or friend. One drove while the other navigated. One backed up the RV while the other gave directions ("Left! LEFT! No, your other left!"). We learned the importance of understanding and being understood!

Those same skills are especially important in an emergency, when stress, noise, and confusion can make communication more challenging.



We practice communication skills every Monday during the park's 4pm FRS/GMRS (walkie-talkie) Radio Roll Call on Channel 6 (everyone is welcome!). When a Block Captain reports their block count or makes an announcement, the Net Control/Moderator repeats the information back to confirm it was heard and understood correctly.

This "repeat-back" can catch misunderstandings before they become issues in an emergency and in everyday life.

Something to think about: How do you make sure that you heard and understood information that a LOVED ONE has shared with you? How do you make sure that YOU were heard and understood?

Something to try: Try "repeat-back" this week. When someone gives you important information, repeat it back in your own words to confirm you understood it.
